

## Board Of Selectmen

January 16

*Condensed from approved minutes*

**Present:** Chairman Dennis Fenton, Selectmen Roger Godwin and Andrew Gup-till, Town Administrator Mark Stetson

Road Agent John Thompson told the Board that his crews are dealing with the myriad of recent weather conditions.

The Board met with Representative Jim Danforth, who told the Board that New Hampshire Department of Transportation (DOT) officials have told him that the work to relocate a short portion of Route 11 near the cemetery in East Andover is scheduled for this summer.

Danforth also told the Board that he is investigating municipally owned or managed wireless Internet systems as a possible revenue source for municipalities. He informed the Board that such systems are being operated successfully elsewhere in the country. He opined that due to the rural nature of most New Hampshire communities, large companies would not be interested in investing in the equipment to make it happen. He told the Board that he is supporting proposed legislation that would permit municipalities to bond the cost of such equipment and to repay the bond with the fees charged for the service.

Danforth also told the Board that DOT officials have told him that the Town would inherit responsibility for fulfilling commitments made by the Friends of the Northern Rail Trail as

part of state grants that the group has received should that entity cease to exist. Danforth then left the meeting.

The Board then met with Alex Bernhard and Myra Mayman representing the Friends of the Northern Rail Trail (FNRT). Mr. Bernhard outlined the work accomplished by the FNRT, which includes upgrading approximately 1.7 miles of the Northern Line railroad right of way from the Blackwater Park to the Potter Place train station. The group was awarded a state grant that provided a majority of the money. He explained that the old stone ballast had been pushed aside and new "hard pack" gravel had been installed. This surface is suitable for pedestrians, bicycles, and the like. He told the Board that the work was accomplished with the endorsement and assistance of the Andover Snowmobile Club.

He went on to explain that the group is seeking a second grant that would fund similar work on approximately 2.7 miles of the rail bed from the Blackwater Park east to Switch Road. He said it is possible that, if all went well, this phase could be stretched to as far as Plains Road.

In response to Bernhard's request for a letter of support for the grant application, Fenton suggested that the FNRT or the state provide answers to questions such as what entity would be responsible for fulfilling any commitments made by the FNRT as part of these grant awards, who is responsible
