

Historical Society Annual Meeting **Andover Snowmobile Club** Presents Judith Moyer Stage Show

The annual meeting of the Andover Historical Society on Friday, October 20, at 7 PM at Proctor Academy's Norris Family Theatre promises to be a special event. A short business meeting and election of officers will precede the presentation by historian Judith Moyer, Ph.D., of her work *It Had to be Done, So I Did It*.

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the first presentation of this stage piece. The dramatic reading by a troupe of actresses was first produced in 1986 and has been performed all over the Northeast since then.

Dr. Moyer is currently on the faculty of the University of New Hampshire in Durham and serves as director of the History in Perspective – Teaching American History Project.

In 1981 Dr. Moyer founded the Warner Women's Oral History project and

she, together with 30 volunteers, spent three years collecting reminiscences of 60 of Warner's oldest women about their lives in the first part of the twentieth century.


The result was thousands of pages of transcripts of audio tapes which she condensed into the words spoken by the actresses – nothing has been fictionalized. The dramatic reading vividly brings to life the story of the women and how their daily lives and work created an indispensable impact on their community and their families.

After the one-hour presentation, a discussion will follow.

The popular presentation is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be provided.
