Two years ago, Rogers promised to cut spending and bring us a more efficient County Attorney's Office. Many said she couldn't do it, but let's look at the facts.

Rogers started a Cyber Crime Unit to work towards protecting us from the new crimes that take place with all the new technology in use today. She has managed to get lots of special training for the prosecutors with the FBI and the National Association of District Attorneys at little or no cost to the taxpayers.

Rogers built an impound lot for vehicles that have to be held for evidence in cases. The impound lot has led to savings for both the county and local police departments who previously would have to pay private storage lots to keep the cars impounded.

Rogers assembled a Juvenile Justice Task Force, calling on close to 100 volunteers to discuss and make plans for how to deal with juvenile crime.

Rogers hired a Juvenile Prosecutor, a new position to work with juveniles and families across the county to prevent today's children from becoming tomorrow's criminals.

Rogers re-negotiated contracts to reduce costs for services used by her office and saved enough money to cut her budget while adding services.

Seems to me we have a true leader with administrative "know how," creative plans for getting things done, and an ability to keep cost down. I think we should re-elect Rogers as Merrimack County Attorney this November.
