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



A paradox is among us: one in nine people struggle with hunger in New Hampshire, while around one third of the food supply goes uneaten and wasted annually in the United States. Creative solutions are constantly being put into action, and "gleaning" is one way that Merrimack County Conservation District (MCCD) is working to solve the problem.

On a Thursday in July, MCCD Local Foods Coordinator Alyssa Lemmermann, picked about 24 pounds of kale at Andover's Two Mountain Farm and brought some of it to the Andover Food Pantry for those in need. As part of the New Hampshire Gleans network, MCCD collects excess or slightly bruised foods from farms, gardens, and farmers markets that would otherwise be thrown away or composted. Gleaned food items are then donated to food pantries, soup kitchens, community suppers, and schools.

In 2014, during MCCD's first year with the Gleaning Program, 9,633

pounds of produce were collected from nine partner farms and donated to seven local agencies, including the Andover Food Pantry. This year, with your help, we hope to expand even more.

Interested in helping? MCCD organizes volunteer crews to harvest produce from area farms. This is an opportunity not only to help those in need within your community, but also to become an active part of your local food system. There are also volunteer opportunities for drivers to pick up and/or drop off donations to local organizations.

Do you have an over-abundant garden this year, or just want to spare some of your goodies to help those in need? MCCD will readily accept your contributions. If you already have a garden, or are interested in starting one, there is the opportunity to participate in "Grow a Row." Produce from that row is donated to help increase access to fresh foods within your community.
