get of \$2,048,924 the Budget Committee recommended reducing the request by \$5,900. Some mileage and seminars were reduced because of COVID-19 restricting in-person training. A Highway Department supervisor with grader operator skills would reduce personnel cost. We also had new requests from social service and community organizations; we reduced their requests until we can assess what more they offer to the community.

The Fire Department budget re-

quired review and some clarification, but otherwise it was tight, appropriate spending. We did recommend some changes to the Water Precinct budget to increase future funds for several projects that will come up in the near future.

The process of assessing and changing budgets for the town of Andover has been a demanding job for all of us. I personally have worked hard, but truly enjoyed working with this very dedicated volunteer group of local residents. I thank you, and the people of Andover should also thank you.
